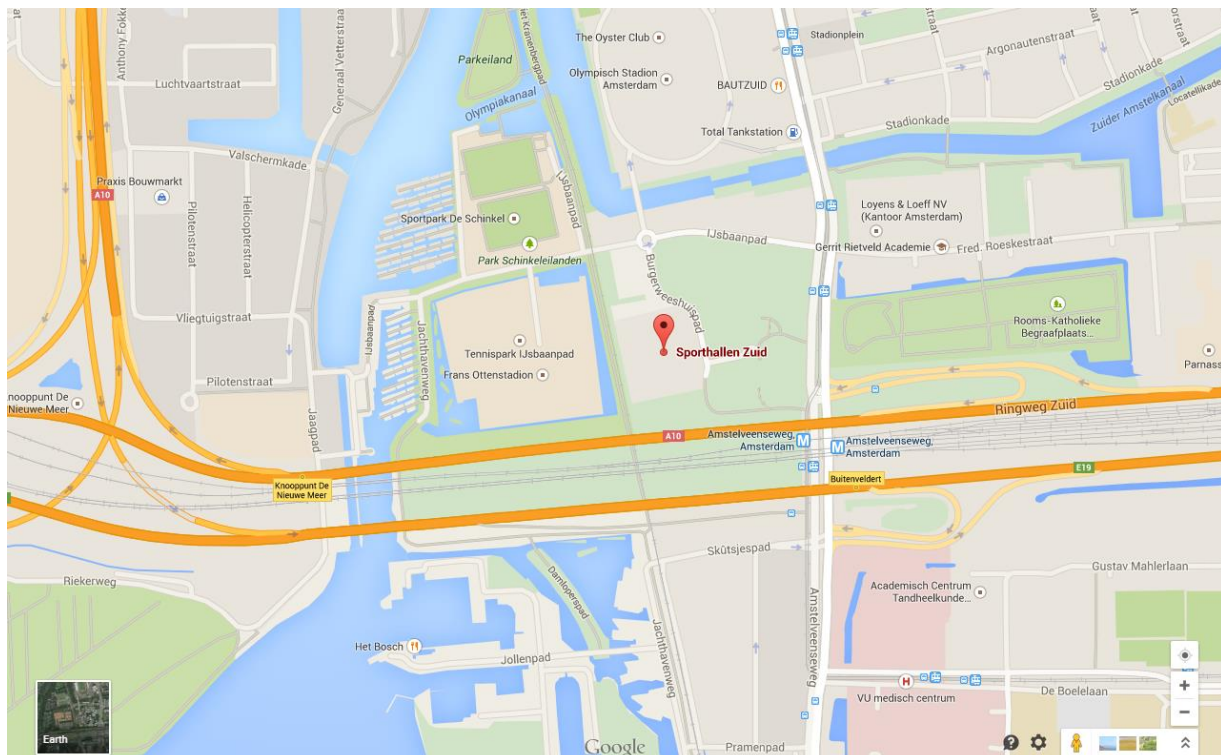

Location

Sporthallen Zuid, Amsterdam

The venue for the seminars and competition is located in the south-west of Amsterdam, just inside the A10 ringroad (exit S108). By public transport metroline 50; buslines 142, 170, 172, 174 (stop “Amstelveenseweg”) and tramlines 16 and 24 (stop “Ijsbaanpad”) are within 10 minutes walk.



Airport

Schiphol Airport, located near Amsterdam, is easily accessible from all over Europe. The best know Dutch airlines are KLM and Transavia, but Schiphol can be reached by many airlines (EasyJet, Ryanair etc.) check for more information

Public transport reaches almost all destinations in Amsterdam. Download the app 9292, or visit <http://9292.nl/en> From Amsterdam Central and Schiphol Airport, it takes about half an hour to get to the Sporthallen Zuid. From Amsterdam Sloterdijk station about 20 min.

By Car

A car can be rented at Schiphol airport. Sporthallen Zuid has paid-parking (max €18,50 per day) with about 75 parking spots. Be aware that parking in Amsterdam is very expensive, up to € 6,- an hour. Paid parking Monday-Saturday 07:00-19:00
